FALL 2016 LEGAL INTERNSHIP WASHINGTON, D.C. or OAKLAND, CA

Public Justice is a national public interest law firm dedicated to pursuing high impact lawsuits to combat social and economic injustice, protect the Earth's sustainability, and challenge predatory corporate conduct and government abuses. It seeks to hire a third-year law school student to work as a legal intern in either its Washington, D.C. headquarters or its Oakland, California office during the fall term. The position is part-time (10-20 hours a week), will start in the fall of 2016, and can accommodate the student's school schedule. Work may be performed remotely.

Public Justice specializes in high-impact, cutting-edge litigation. Our lawsuits fight for consumers' and victims' rights, the environment, civil rights and civil liberties, public health and safety, workers' rights, government and corporate accountability, and the protection of the poor and powerless. Our Access to Justice Campaign works to keep the courthouse doors open for all—by battling federal preemption, unnecessary court secrecy, class action bans and abuses, unfair mandatory arbitration, and other efforts to deprive people of their day in court.

Public Justice's legal interns research and develop new cases in conjunction with our staff attorneys, law fellows, and cooperating counsel. They also provide assistance to attorneys in ongoing litigation. Their work does not, however, focus on our Environmental Enforcement Project. Our interns are involved in legal research and writing, case review, and brainstorming on theories and approaches designed to ensure that justice is achieved.

We will help students secure credit and/or funding from their schools, if possible, and where necessary will provide supplemental funding equivalent to the minimum wage.

Public Justice values and promotes diversity. We invite applications from candidates regardless of race, gender, national origin, sexual orientation, age, or disability.

Applications will be considered on a rolling basis, so we encourage you to apply as soon as possible. Applications should consist of a cover letter, resume, writing sample, transcript, and contact information for two references. Please send your application to Victoria Ni at vni@publicjustice.net.
