**Sexual Assault Survivor and National Title IX Legal and Policy Advocates Respond to Secretary DeVos' Roll Back of Title IX Guidance**

*On the Record, Media-Only Call in Response to Secretary DeVos' Changes to How Schools Investigate Title IX Violations*

National Title IX policy and legal advocates will join a sexual assault survivor for an on the record, media-only call in response to the Department of Education's newly released Title IX Q&A document, which rolls back 2011 and 2014 guidance provided to schools regarding federal Title IX law and campus sexual assault investigations. The legal advocates and policy experts, along with sexual assault survivor Abby Honold, will discuss the new guidance and highlight what it means for survivors of campus sexual violence.
