SURVIVORS OF OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY SEXUAL ASSAULT TO QUESTION REPORT FINDINGS AND DEMAND SPECIFIC ACTIONS

COLUMBUS, OH – On <u>Tuesday, May 21st at 10:30 a.m. EST</u>, survivors of the ongoing sexual assault scandal at The Ohio State University will join a national press call to raise questions about the findings of the OSU-commission report. Joined by attorneys, the survivors will also make public a list of actions that OSU must take in order to show commitment to holding itself accountable.

Additional Background:

More than 50 survivors of former Ohio State University doctor Richard Strauss have demanded justice and accountability from the school in the wake of revelations that, while employed by Ohio State, Dr. Strauss is believed to have abused hundreds and even thousands of OSU students over at least two decades.

While Dr. Strauss committed suicide in 2005, the administration of Ohio State University has yet to fully and accurately account for either the number of students victimized by his predatory behavior or for the school's own role in enabling that conduct for decades. Public Justice, Emery Celli and Scott Elliot Smith, LPA are working with the survivors to help hold OSU accountable and seek justice for the irreparable harms they suffered while at the school. The case is captioned Snyder-Hill, et al. v. The Ohio State University, 18-CV-00736, in federal court in Columbus.
