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6. Declaration of D. Jack Guthrie in Support of Defendant Monroe School District's Opposition to Plaintiffs' Motion for Video Depositions;

- 7. Plaintiffs' Reply in Support of Motion for Video Depositions;
- 8. Declaration of Richard H. Friedman in Support of Plaintiffs' Reply Re Motion for Video Depositions;
- 9. The findings made in all prior King County Emergency Orders 1-4 detailing the state of emergency due to the novel coronavirus disease;
- 10. The findings made in the Supreme Court of Washington Order of March 18, 2020, authorizing this Court to hear emergency matters by telephone, video or other means that does not require in-person attendance;

and being otherwise fully advised in this matter, the Court rules as follows:

Plaintiffs' Motion for Video Depositions is **GRANTED** in part and **DENIED** in part. The Court hereby orders as follows:

- To protect the health and safety of all attorneys and witnesses during the novel coronavirus state of emergency in a manner that still maintains consistent and equitable access to justice, all fact witness depositions shall go forward in all Sky Valley Education Center cases assigned to this Court for discovery and pretrial management by utilizing telephone, video, or other means that does not require inperson attendance.
- Plaintiffs, experts, and treating medical providers are excluded from this order at this
  time. They are not to be deposed by video, telephone or other means that does not
  require in-person attendance. The issue of video depositions will be re-addressed at a
  status conference April 28, 2020.
- Until the novel coronavirus state of emergency is lifted, and pursuant to the March 23,
   2020, order of Gov. Jay Inslee prohibiting non-essential personal contact, no attorney shall be permitted to attend any deposition in-person.
- The parties are directed to work together to select the appropriate court reporting company that offers remote video deposition technology so that each participant may attend remotely from their home, office or anywhere else that has a high-speed internet
