FALL 2020 LAW CLERKS REMOTE

Public Justice is a nonprofit organization dedicated to pursuing high impact lawsuits to combat social and economic injustice, protect the Earth's sustainability, and challenge predatory corporate conduct and government abuses. It seeks to hire two Law Clerks for Fall 2020. In light of the current pandemic, Fall 2020 Law Clerks will work remotely and need not be physically located near our offices. Both law clerks will work with attorneys based in both offices and elsewhere around the country.

Public Justice specializes in high-impact, cutting-edge litigation. Our lawsuits fight for consumers' and victims' rights; the environment; a just, sustainable, and accountable animal agriculture industry; civil rights and civil liberties; workers' rights; government and corporate accountability; and the protection of the poor and powerless. Our Access to Justice Campaign works to keep the courthouse doors open for all—by battling federal preemption, unnecessary court secrecy, class action barriers and abuses, unfair mandatory arbitration, and other efforts to deprive people of their day in court.

Public Justice's law clerks research and develop new cases in conjunction with our staff attorneys, law fellows, and cooperating counsel. They also provide assistance to attorneys in ongoing litigation. Our law clerks are involved in legal research and writing, case review, and brainstorming on theories and approaches designed to ensure that justice is achieved.

This position is open to those who can secure academic credit for their work with Public Justice. We will help students secure academic credit from their schools.
