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1		DECLARATION OF CERISE CASTLE
2		I, Cerise Castle, declare and state as follows:
3	1.	I am the Managing Editor of KnockLA, a nonprofit community journalism project dedicated
4		to telling the real story of Los Angeles.
5	2.	In addition to serving as Managing Editor and contributor to KnockLA, I have produced and
6		hosted segments for the Emmy-award winning nightly news program, VICE News Tonight,
7		and NPR as well as series for the podcasting giant, Wondery. My reporting and commentary
8		have been featured in publications like The Daily Beast, The Los Angeles Times, Los
9		Angeles Magazine, and MTV.
10	3.	Knock LA, then styled KNOCK.LA, began life as a Medium blog in 2017. It was created by
11		members of Ground Game LA, a grassroots community organizing group, to fill the gap in
12		alt-weekly coverage of Los Angeles left by the death of LA Weekly. Then as now, Knock
13		LA was powered by passionate journalists, organizers, and advocates working together to
14		bring a new perspective to Angelenos.
15	4.	KnockLA believes in the tradition of community organizing and journalism as a public
16		service. We believe that, when unobserved and underreported, power leads to corruption.
17	5.	KnockLA seeks to create accurate and reliable hyperlocal coverage of Los Angeles
18		exploring critical issues like law enforcement misconduct, the housing and homelessness
19		crisis, and corporate labor abuses. For example, on July 14, 2023, we published a story titled
20		"LA Workers are Taking to the Streets." In that piece, we discussed six major labor actions
21		in Los Angeles against large corporate entities, including Amazon, UPS, and the Alliance of
22		Motion Picture and Television Producers.
23	6.	KnockLA has a demonstrated commitment to protecting freedom of the press and
24		demanding government transparency. Our reporters routinely file public records requests
25		and review court records or attend court hearings.
26	7.	We have previously moved to unseal court records that are of public interest. In 2022, we
27		were successful in unsealing a search warrant executed by the Los Angeles Sheriff's

2	keeping the search warrant sealed two years after execution.		
3	8. Covering stories about issues impacting workers in Los Angeles and statewide is impor	tant	
4	to KnockLA. Stories about this case matter not just to people employed by Disney, but to	o all	
5	members of the community who seek to better understand how workplace discrimination		
6	operates or how large companies profit from the labor of underpaid workers.
